Please read it carefully and share with your Parents/Carers so that they are also aware of the examination regulations and the procedures to follow in the event of any problems occurring.

The awarding bodies (or examination boards) set strict criteria which must be followed for the conduct of examinations and Saint John Wall is required to follow them precisely. You should therefore, pay particular attention to the JCQ Information for Candidates link on page 14.

Please see a list of frequently asked questions at the back of this booklet.

If there is anything you do not understand or any question that has not been addressed, please go to the Exams Office and ask.

Before the Exams

Your Attendance

Year 11

You are required to follow your timetable, except when attending examinations or revision sessions. Make sure you are in school every day and attend all sessions. **You will not be able to re-sit an examination if you are absent.**

Your candidate or exam number

You have been given a candidate number (sometimes called Exam Number) – you will find this on the top of your Individual Candidate Timetable. It would help if you learnt this number as you will need to write it on **every** exam paper you complete along with your **Full Legal Name**.

Individual Candidate Timetable

This document is **important** and should be kept safely for reference purposes, all pupils **MUST** refer to their Individual Candidate Timetable for information on rooming, seating and times of examinations. Please read your timetable very carefully to make sure you know when and where your exams take place. If you think you have the wrong exam/tier on your timetable or think you are missing an exam, see the Exams Office immediately.

You need to remain available for exams (even if you have no timetabled exams) until the contingency day **Wednesday 25th June 2025**.

Your timetable is unique to you. Do not ask your friends where the exam is. They may be somewhere different!

If you lose your timetable, you can get a replacement from the Exams Office.

The full examination timetable is published on the Exams & Revision section of the school website. **However, you should always refer to your Individual Candidate Timetable first.**

Exam Start Times

Morning Examinations start at **9.15 am**

Afternoon Examinations start at **1.15 pm**

These times may vary so please rely on **your** individual timetable – not your friend's timetable – as it could be different.

Rooming

We will use the **Gym for most large exams**, but we will also **use other classrooms** in the school – your timetable will tell you where to go Please check it carefully!

Uniform

Year 11 – Full School Uniform must be worn at **ALL** times, when sitting exams, and when you are in school.

During the Exams

Being Silent!

Once you enter the exam room, **YOU ARE UNDER EXAM BOARD RULES AND SHOULD REMAIN SILENT**, until the examination is over, and you are well away from the exam room. You must not communicate with any other pupil either by speaking or mouthing to them. Even eye contact or smiling at another pupil is counted as communicating! This is treated as misconduct/malpractice and must be reported to examination boards. This is treated severely by them – you could be disqualified from your exams – **BEWARE!**

You may not pass anything to another pupil in an examination. If you need to borrow a pen or pencil or have a question – put your hand up and speak to an invigilator – they are there to help you.

At the start of an Examination

You must check that you have the correct paper in front of you..... Always let an invigilator know **immediately** if you think this is incorrect in any way.

You will be told **when and how** to complete the details on the front of your exam paper or the answer booklet.

LISTEN carefully to all instructions given at the start of the exam and make sure you know how long you have to complete the paper.

Only write in **BLACK** ink or **BLACK** biro. Gel pens **cannot** be used. Only use pencil for diagrams. Do not use erasable pens, correction fluid or correction pens.

Highlighter pens may be used on questions within the question paper, but **NEVER** used on answer papers or your own work.

You cannot ask the invigilators questions regarding the content of the exam, but if you think there is something incorrect or missing from your paper, then put your hand up and ask for guidance.

When your exam has finished, and your papers and equipment have been collected in, you will be dismissed a row at a time. **PLEASE LEAVE IN SILENCE** – other pupils may still be working in the room or an adjoining room. You are not allowed to take anything from the exam room except your own possessions – **it is an offence to remove any exam materials**.

PLEASE DO NOT DISTURB THE REST OF THE SCHOOL.

The correct equipment

It is **your responsibility** to ensure that you have the necessary equipment with you for each examination.

Your clear exam pencil case should include:

- black pens x 2
- pencils x 2
- eraser
- ruler
- pencil sharpener- can be borrowed from an invigilator

Calculator (no calculator covers)
Compass
Protractor

} These items are supplied by school
for Maths Exams.

There is a limited supply of spare stationary items available should yours stop working. Please make sure you check your equipment before your exam-you could lose valuable time while waiting for a spare.

You must not bring any unauthorised items, papers, cards, books or any other items into the exam room – this is **CHEATING/MALPRACTICE** and will be reported to the Exam Boards. ALWAYS CHECK YOUR POCKETS.

No food or drink are allowed in the exam room except for water in a clear bottle without any labels/writing, these need to be removed before you enter the exam room.

Spectacle/Glasses cases should not be brought into the exam room, if brought in by mistake they must be given to an Invigilator.

Mobile phones, Watches, Data storage devices, MP3 players, and any other gadgets

You should not bring these items to school during the examination period but if this is unavoidable, **they must be stored in your locker** before the exam. At the beginning of an examination the invigilators will ask you to finally check that you do not have any mobile phones, watches, MP3 players, or any other data storage devices or items in the room.

Please note that if you are found to have a mobile phone or data storage device in your possession, whether it is turned on or not or whether you intend to use it or not the school has no choice but to report the incident to the examination boards and it is their decision whether to accept your exam script or not.

The Examination Boards wish to make it clear to all pupils that being in possession of mobile phones, pagers, MP3 players, data storage devices, smart glasses, web enabled technology (including smart, digital or analogue watches) or any other unauthorised device into an examination is **STRICTLY FORBIDDEN and may result in zero marks.**

Please be aware that any infringement of this rule **WILL** be reported to the relevant Examination Board. **Do not risk it – there are no exceptions!**

Your coats, bags and valuables

For all exams any coats, bags and personal belongings must be stored in your personal locker

Invigilators

The school employs trained exam invigilators to conduct the examinations. Pupils are expected to behave in a respectful manner towards all invigilators and follow their instructions at all times.

Invigilators are in the examination room to supervise the conduct of the examination. They will distribute and collect the examination papers, tell candidates when to start and finish the examination, hand out extra writing booklets if required and deal with any problems that occur during the examination. Invigilators cannot help you with the exam papers or explain questions, so please do not ask.

Travel arrangements

It is **your** responsibility to ensure you arrive at the examination room before the examination is due to start, using the timings on your individual candidate timetable. If your exam is not due to finish until after 3.10pm, you must inform Parent/Carers and make your own arrangements to get home.

If you are Unwell/Late

If you are ill or going to be late on the day of your exam, you or your parent/carer should notify the school **IMMEDIATELY** on **0121 554 1825 to be advised what to do next.**

If you are late for an exam, please get a Parent/Carer to hold your mobile phone and supervise you and bring you to school, and report to the Exams Officer. If you go straight to the examination room, please report to the main Invigilator if the Exam Officer is not available.

You must be aware that if you are **late** your exam paper may not be accepted by the Exam Board, so it is important that you are ready before your exam start time. If the Exam Board chooses not to accept your paper, you will receive 0 marks for that paper. The Exam Boards take lateness very seriously as it can impact on the security of the exam.

If you are unable to attend due to **serious illness**, you or your parent/carer must obtain a medical note from the doctor or complete a Self-Certification Form (available from the Exams Office) this form should be submitted to the Exams Office as soon as possible. The self-certification form must give specific information about dates and exact reasons why you could not sit the paper. Without this the Exam Boards will not consider issuing a final GCSE, Cambridge National or GCE grade for the missed exam during the summer season, it is at their discretion as to whether they feel the absence was justified.

Special Consideration

The school can only write to the Exam Board to ask for Special Consideration in exceptional circumstances, the maximum allowance given is 5%. Feeling unwell or stressed will, unfortunately, not qualify for Special Consideration.

Deaths of close family members and major traumas do qualify, but for medical reasons we will require a doctor's letter or a Self-Certificate specifying dates and exact reasons – otherwise we will not be able to submit an application to the Exam Board.

Remember Special Consideration is only applied for in exceptional circumstances.

Frequently Asked Questions

What if the fire alarm goes off?

If the fire alarm does go off during an exam, you will be told to put your pens down and to sit in silence while awaiting instructions. The Exams Officer or Invigilator will lead you to the assembly point in an orderly manner and in **SILENCE. You must not communicate with the other candidates, and you will remain under exam conditions at all times.** The length of time of disruption will be noted and will be added on at the end, the exam board will be notified of the situation, and special consideration will be requested if necessary.

What if I feel ill during the exam?

If you feel unwell during an exam, raise your hand and wait for an invigilator to come to you. Explain what the problem is, and they will deal with it appropriately. **Please remember – if you have a cold or suffer from hay fever, use your medication before the examination and bring plenty of tissues with you and show the invigilator that you have them with you.**

What if I need to go to the toilet during the exam?

You will only be allowed to go to the toilet if you have a known illness or are absolutely desperate to go during the exam, raise your hand and wait for an invigilator to come to you. You will then be escorted to the toilet. **Please remember – going to the toilet not only disturbs other candidates in the room, but it also breaks your concentration.** Also, you will **not** receive additional time.

What if I have a clash in the examination timetable?

Depending on the total length of the exams, you will take them one after the other in either the morning or afternoon session. Any serious clashes will have been identified by the Exams Office, and you will have been informed what arrangements have been made. We can move an exam due to a clash from a morning to afternoon session (or vice versa) in some circumstances. If this happens, you will be isolated and supervised between the exams in order to maintain the security of the exam and will need to bring a packed lunch.

What if I have an appointment the same day as my exam?

You **MUST change** your appointment! Exams **MUST** happen at the date and time specified by the exam board. Going to the dentist, doctor, on holiday, or to a wedding is not a valid excuse.

For the scribblers!

Defacing of exam papers or writing obscene or offensive words or drawings is forbidden and could result in you being disqualified!

Even doodling or colouring letters is forbidden so do not write anything that is not directly to do with your answer.

This also applies to writing on your skin or person, and you will be asked to remove it before or during an exam

Graffiti on exam desks is also forbidden! All the desks and labels are scribble free and we would like to keep it that way. We have detailed seating plans, and we will know **who you are!**

After the Exams

Book Returns

You will need to return any textbooks and library books after your last examination in each subject. When you have returned all items and have been signed off by all departments.

Leavers Mass

Leavers Mass is our celebration for Year 11 as the culmination of your time at Saint John Wall Catholic School.

Results Day

GCSE results day is on **Thursday 21st August 2025**.

Year 11 -You can collect your results from **10.00am-12.30pm**.

Year 10 & Y9 - You will be given your results when you return to school in September, or you can collect them **after 11.00am** on Thursday 21st August 2025 if you wish

If you are unable to collect your results from school on this date, you can collect them from the Exams Office in September 2025.

If you wish to have your results posted, you should **give a stamped, self-addressed A5 sized envelope** to Mrs Holder in the Exams Office **before Friday 11th July 2025**. Your results will then be posted on the afternoon of results day. Sorry, but we are **not able to give out results over the phone, or email** and we **cannot** give them to a friend/relative to deliver for you.

Permission for someone else to collect your results

If you wish someone (even your parent/carer) to collect your results for you, you must print and complete the form on the website. The results of your examinations are **your** property. Until you have received them, we are not allowed to release them to anyone else – or even tell someone what the results are.

Unless you give the school **prior** specific written permission for someone else to pick them up on your behalf, without **your** permission, **we will refuse to give them out**.

Every year, on results day, parents and friends (even brothers and sisters) ask for the results of a pupil who is away on holiday or working or unable to get to school. We **cannot** give them to anyone without your written permission.

To avoid any difficulty, please print and fill in the form below or on the school website and bring it to the Exams Office before 11th July 2025 and inform the person you have chosen to collect the results that they must bring ID with them in order to collect them.

Post Results Services

If you are concerned about any aspect of your results, please speak to your Subject Teacher or Head of Department urgently on results day or asap – there are strict deadlines provided by the Exam Board and these are not negotiable. If you are not able to find your Subject Teacher or Head of Department on Results Day, please go to any Head of Department, Senior Teacher or the Exams Officer.

Address

If you change address, mobile number or **personal** email address after the exams please notify the school so you are contacted where necessary for results queries collection of certificates etc. Please note your **school** email address will close at the end of June 2025.

Certificates

Year 11 will receive their certificates at a Special Event; an invitation will be sent to your home address or via email.

If you are unable to attend the certificate event, then you can collect your certificates during normal school hours from the Exams Office following the Certificate Awards Event. Exam certificates are legal documents and must be signed for.

If you cannot collect your certificates in person, then you can write a short note (signed and dated) nominating another person to collecting your certificates on your behalf and they must produce ID.

Saint John Wall Catholic School **is** only obliged to keep certificates for a period of **one year, after a year certificates may be destroyed**. It is vital that all certificates are collected as you will need them for job interviews and entrance into Further Education

establishments. Certificates are very costly and difficult to replace and can only be obtained directly from the Awarding bodies, **PLEASE KEEP THEM SAFE.**

Careers Advice

Several senior members of staff will be available to discuss any concerns you may have on results day. A Post-16 Career's Advisor will also be present.

And finally...

These exams represent the culmination of several years of your hard work at Saint John Wall Catholic School. Do not behave in any way that might jeopardise your chances or those of other pupils in the exam room. **Remember – even eye contact can be taken as communication!**

Exam Board rules are strict and must be followed to the letter – the School and Exams Officer have no choice but to report any breaking of rules. Any misbehaviour or infringement of rules **MUST** be reported to the Exam Board and will **ALWAYS** be dealt with very severely.
