# **AIM OF BOOKLET**

The aim of this booklet is to give you an overview of how each subject area will be using the coming weeks to gather further evidence using teacher assessments to inform your final qualification grade.

# How to use this booklet:

Use the booklet to check what assessments or evidence you will need to complete. There is guidance to state what these topic areas might be and also the format of the assessment or evidence.

# Ensuring work is your own:

It is crucial that the work that you produce is your own work. If the work is not your own it can result in work being discounted and may affect all your qualifications.

# **Storing evidence:**

Ensure that you keep all work safe. Your teachers will keep most of the evidence in school but it is also important that you keep all notes and material that you are provided with as additional evidence.

# **Access Arrangements:**

Access arrangements will be available for all pupils that require them. When you are completing work that could be used as evidence you will be given the opportunity to use these.

# **GCSE OCR Art**

# How will your teacher collect evidence for your grade?

Your grade will be based on the quality of your portfolio of Art work. Your teacher will consider your observational drawings, experiments and a final piece if you have completed one. A final piece is not required, the quality of the work that you have produced is more important rather than the quantity.

# What might I be asked to do?

Complete all aspects agreed with your teacher, using your personal checklist. You will complete these in class and can come back after school and lunchtime as agreed with your teacher.

# What topics might this evidence cover?

A portfolio of practical work showing your personal response to either a centre- or learner-set starting point, brief, scenario or stimulus.

# What skills/knowledge will I need to show?

AO1 Develop ideas through investigations, demonstrating critical understanding of sources.

AO2 Refine work by exploring ideas, selecting and experimenting with appropriate media, materials, techniques and processes.

AO3 Record ideas, observations and insights relevant to intentions as work progresses.

AO4 Present a personal and meaningful response that realises intentions and demonstrates understanding of visual language.

# What question type might I be asked to answer?

There is no written assessment, just your artwork portfolio.

# How will your teacher collect evidence for your grade?

Your grade will be based on your Component 2 LAA coursework assignment, the 'Comprehensive Business Plan'. We will also look at the work/grades for Component 1 and Component 3 claimed last year. There will also be some exam theory assessments taking place to allow us to judge if we can raise the exam grade banked in Year 10.

# What might I be asked to do?

Complete all sections of the LAA outline word document you have been using to date and using the feedback provided by your teacher. You will complete these in class, at home were required and can come back after school were organised with staff.

# What topics might this evidence cover?

Testing, collecting and analysing data, reflection on your findings, consider any issues, and suggest solutions.

There will be a set task with two parts: practical supervised assessment and written assessment based on the practical task.

Assessments in the gym, questions completed in high level controlled, timed conditions that are of exam type questions in classrooms. # What might I be asked to do?

Exam questions set from the texts studied during the course. These will reflect past paper style questions.

# What topics might this evidence cover?

An Inspector Calls, MacBeth and A Christmas Carol.

A variety of fiction and non-fiction extracts which are the sources related to specific Language papers.

# What might I be asked to do?

Exam questions set from the specification studied during the course. These will reflect past paper style questions or assessment materials provided by the exam board.

# What topics might this evidence cover?

Theme 1 – Identity and culture: Me, my family and friends / Technology in everyday life / Free-time activities /Customs and festivals

Theme 2 – Local, national, international and global areas of interest: Home, town, neighbourhood and region / Social issues / Global issues / Travel and tourism

# What might I be asked to do?

# What topics might this evidence cover?

# What skills/knowledge will I need to show?

# How will your teacher collect evidence for your grade?

Questions completed in high level controlled, timed conditions that are of exam type questions in classrooms. You will be told by your teachers before completing any work/assessment if it will count towards your evidence. This will be done in advance of the lesson or assessment.

# What might I be asked to do?

Exam questions set from the specification studied during the course. These will reflect past paper style questions.

# What topics might this evidence cover?

- Crime and punishment in Britain, c1000—present and Whitechapel, c1870—c1900: crime, policing and the inner city.
- Early Elizabethan England, 1558–88.
- Weimar and Nazi Germany, 1918–39

# What skills/knowledge will I need to show?

Component 1 is banked from last year and you have completed Component 2 this year. For Component 3 (the external exam) you will have assessments in the gym. Past mock papers may also be used to supplement evidence for your overall grade.

# What might I be asked to do?

Exam questions from past papers.

# How will your teacher collect evidence for your grade?

Unit 2 consists of your Flip Flop Resort coursework and practical cooking assessment. For Unit 1 (the external exam) you will have assessments in the gym. You will be told by your teachers before completing any assessment if it will count towards your evidence. This will be done in advance of the lesson or assessment. Past mock papers may also be used to supplement evidence for your overall grade.

# What might I be asked to do?

# **GCSE Pearson-Edexcel Mathematics**

# How will your teacher collect evidence for your grade?

There will be formal assessments in both the classroom and in the gym, in timed conditions using exam style questions. Evidence will also be used from any previous assessments and classwork which shows that you are able to complete Maths at a certain level. You will be told by your teachers before completing assessment if it will count towards your evidence.

# What might I be asked to do?

Complete exam style questions set from past papers and from new assessment materials.

# What topics might this evidence cover?

Questions on all topics that you have been taught in Number, FDPRP (Fractions, Decimals, Percentages, Ratio and proportion), Algebra, Geometry, Statistics and Probability. These will include exam style questions which test several topics in the same questions.

# What skills/knowledge will I need to show?

AO1 – Use and apply standard technique:

- accurately recall facts, terminology and definitions
- use and interpret notation correctly
- accurately carry out routine procedures or set tasks requiring multi-step solutions.

# What might I be asked to do?

Complete all coursework required, rehearse for your performance and perform your piece whilst being recorded in front of your teacher.

# What topics might this evidence cover?

Your chosen musical piece.

# What skills/knowledge will I need to show?

Organisation, instrument specific skills, independent work, self-assessment, target setting and meeting deadlines.

Learning aim A: Develop your music performance skills and review your own practice.

Learning Aim B: Use your music performance skills within rehearsal and performance.

# What question type might I be asked to answer?

There is no exam style written assessment just your coursework and performance recording.

# What question type might I be asked to answer?

# **GCSE Eduqas-WJEC Route B in RE**

# How will your teacher collect evidence for your grade?

Your teachers will be collecting evidence from your blue assessment book. They will collect a score for your best A type, one B, one C and one D. Your result from your Judaism mock back in November will also be used. Your teachers will then record your scores from the two exams that will take place over the next few months. The scores for the three exams listed above will be added together to give you a working at grade (what level you are working at now). Your teacher will then be able to calculate your teacher assessed grade using all this evidence.

# What might I be asked to do?

You will be asked to complete additional exam questions in your blue assessment book. You will be asked to sit two exams in timed exam conditions, one in the classroom and one in the gym. You will be given time in lessons and at home to prepare for these exams and revision will focus on the topics you are to be tested on. All questions used on exam papers will come from past papers.

# What topics might this evidence cover?

The topics we have chosen to cover for your evidence are:

- -Origins & Meanings (Component 1)
- -Sin & Forgiveness (Component 2)
- -Judaism (Component 3)

These three areas will provide evidence from the three different papers.

# What skills/knowledge will I need to show?

You will need to demonstrate your ability to define, describe, explain and discuss key teachings in RE. One of the most important things to remember is KFCS and how you can structure that into your answers.

# What question type might I be asked to answer?

You will be asked to complete A, B, C & D questions to make sure we cover all skill areas.


