Chair of Governors Message

'Nobody knows the way it's gonna be'

Thanks to a current TV advert these words from Oasis have become very familiar to us. As we pass the first anniversary of the Covid restrictions I can't help but think how prophetic these proved to be. Whether it be family-life, working, shopping or travelling much has changed since last March. Doubtless many of us have suffered the loss of a loved one. They and their families remain in our prayers.

Education too has been affected. Saint John Wall like all schools has experienced enforced closures followed by partial and then full re-openings. As governors only on rare occasions have we been able to actually visit the school. The huge development in the use of technology, however, has been one of the few silver linings in the dark cloud Covid has cast over us.

Thanks to email, texts, phone-calls and virtual meetings I have been able to keep in regular contact with Miss Marston. She has kept me informed of important matters such as the well-being of pupils and staff, necessary risk assessments and the introduction of remote learning. At a meeting last week of the full governing body Miss Marston gave a comprehensive review of what has been carried out particularly over the past term. The governors expressed their thanks and appreciation for what she, the teachers and all the support staff have done to enable pupils to be cared for and their learning maintained both in and out of school.

Miss Marston was also keen to report how you as parents have played your part. She praised the interest you show in the school, the support for your children and the

encouragement you continue to give the staff. It may be a cliché but it is certainly true that we are all in this together.

At a meeting of the site staff earlier this week I learned of the improvements to the building planned for the Easter holidays. Roof repairs, the laying of classroom flooring and the arrival of new desks are only some of works to be carried out. I'm sure the pupils will benefit from all the changes when they return.

I've mentioned before what a valuable window into the world of Saint John Wall the school website is. It has always been informative but now having been revamped it is even easier to find whatever you may be looking for. To be updated of the events and goings-on at school do please keep using it.

We look back with sadness at the misery the pandemic has caused. This being Holy Week, however, coinciding as it does with the better weather and lighter evenings, we have cause for optimism. The Easter message is one of hope and so perhaps at long last the awful circumstances we've had to endure over the past twelve months will begin to diminish. So, until the next time do take care and have a peaceful Easter. I'll end with this prayer:

Risen Lord, shed your light on those who live in the shadow of death and warm the hearts of those who have lost hope. May your love be shared amongst us and so teach us to help and care for each other.

Message from the UK Government

Testing at home throughout the Easter holidays for schools and colleges

Following the success of the asymptomatic testing programme on the return to school and college, it is vital to keep testing at home throughout the Easter holidays and into the summer term. Please pass on this message to all of your staff, students and parents:

- test twice a week at home from now on (all those who are able to)
- report results [online](#) as positive, negative or void. This information is critical in helping us to understand the prevalence of the virus across the country
- continue to test twice weekly over the Easter holidays
- test before returning to school or college for the summer term, either the night before, or morning of, the first day back, to find and isolate any positive cases

This week as a Catholic community, we focused on Holy Week. This is the final week of Lent and final week of Jesus' life. It is one of the most important weeks of the liturgical calendar.

On Monday, we discussed Palm Sunday in form time. This day focuses on Jesus' triumphant entry on a donkey into Jerusalem. Crowds of townspeople were waiting for him, they threw clothes and palms, in front of him as a sign of respect. This was normal practice for people of great power (e.g. Kings). The people shouted "Hosanna!" "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" as he entered the city.

Each form group received a palm cross, blessed in one of our local parishes. This cross was used in form time to show the importance of Palm Sunday. Each form displayed their palm cross proudly on their prayer board.

During formtime on Wednesday, the Values@SJW PowerPoint focused on 'Spy Wednesday'. This is the day where Judas arranged his betrayal of Jesus with the chief priests; he was a spy among the disciples of Jesus. We discussed the idea of loyalty and betrayal and how important Judas' role was in Jesus' death.

On Maundy Thursday, Jesus celebrated his last supper with his friends. After the meal, he also washed their feet. This may sound strange but he did it to show them how to serve others. By doing this, Jesus was encouraging the disciples to continue his work on earth after his death.

We ended our term on Maundy Thursday with a service. This service was put together by pupils in Year 7, 8 and 9. A huge thank you to Miss Cummings, Mrs Ellis & the following pupils for putting this service together for us:

Year 8 Ecosystem - Sampling method

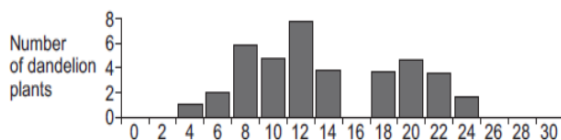

As part of Year 8 KS3 Science Ecosystem topic, 8X1 carried out field work on the Year 9 playground to investigate distribution of plants. They used Quadrats - a sampling method to investigate plant distribution.



These are placed randomly in the habitat and you can then count the number of species in the quadrat. They come in different sizes, some are having grids, some are open.

- They only work for immobile/slow moving populations.
- The more data you collect, the more reproducible your result...the more samples the better!
- Quadrats are placed randomly to avoid bias.



30 meters of a section across the Year 9 field was studied and the above bar chart shows pupils' results.
