Headteacher's Message

Dear Parents and Carers, it has been a busy and successful week inducting all pupils in all year groups back to school. They have listened carefully to the new safety procedures and systems and quickly learnt what is expected of them. Thankyou to all parents and staff who have worked so hard to get the pupils safely back to school. All pupils have returned looking really smart and teachers have commented and praised them for their motivation and engagement in lessons. It is great to be back! A reminder that pupils must bring their own writing equipment and pencil case. Pupils also need to have a waterproof coat because outdoor spaces will be used even in wet weather. Pupils also need to bring their own re-usable water bottle which can be re-filled during lunchtimes.

Next week there will be a training programme in place to ensure that all pupils and staff are fully prepared to be able to access online lessons via Microsoft Teams. Year 7 and 8 pupils will receive training in their computing lessons. Year 11, 10 and 9 pupils will receive training on Monday and Wednesday during collective worship and some lesson time. Staff will receive extra training including demonstrations on Tuesday afternoon. In order to facilitate this training school will close on Tuesday at 2.10pm for Year 8 and 9; 2.20pm for Year 10 and 11 and 2.30pm for Year 7. There was already a calendared early closure for Open Evening. However, due to safety reasons this will not take place so we are going to make use of the time for extra staff training instead. We feel that it is vital that we prioritise online lesson training at this time in case of any future lockdowns.

Pupils have been introduced to our new staff this week too. We are very pleased to have welcomed them and we look forward to working with them all to 'educate each and every unique child in our care to hear and respond to what God calls them to be'.
