Headteacher's Message

Thankyou to all Year 9 and Year 10 parents and pupils who were flexible on Monday when the school had to partially close due to a flood. This meant that we had to block off some of the one-way system and needed to reduce the numbers of pupils on site to be covid safe. All Year 9 and 10 lessons were taught remotely via Teams.

Next week we have a few more closures, but these are planned and calendared. Monday is a bank holiday and school will be closed to all pupils and staff. Tuesday 4 May is a normal school day. On Wednesday 5 May school will be closing to all pupils at 1.15pm. This is so that staff and Year 8 parents can carry out Pathways appointments via Teams. The school is being used as a polling station on Thursday 6 May and is required to close to pupils for safeguarding reasons. Pupils in Years 7, 9, 10 and 11 will be set work via email that they can complete independently on Thursday. Year 8 pupils will be able to access pathways sessions via Teams. Friday 7 May is a normal school day.

I am sorry that these closures are occurring in the same week, but the pathways process was delayed by the winter lockdown and must now take place. We have tried to reduce disruption as much as possible by providing independent learning activities for the polling day. Thankyou again for your flexibility and understanding during these unprecedented times.

This week as a Catholic community, we focused on joy in times of difficulty. In Collective Worship, Miss Marston discussed the recent events in the Queen's life as an example of this. The Queen's husband, Prince Philip recently passed away. They had been married for over 70 years and photos showed them sharing great joy together. In contrast on 17 April, we saw the Queen deep in grief, yet taking inner strength from her faith.

When we think of joy in a spiritual context then we begin to understand that actually there is something deeper than a 'feeling of happiness'.

So many of us have experienced grief this year, not just the Queen. From this week's scripture, and the Queen's behaviour recently, we get this sense that joy is something that can empower us; that can give us the ability to **move forward when things are tough**. Joy helps us build our resilience. We can take great courage from that, great strength from faith.

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Bucket Three Year 8 Masterclass

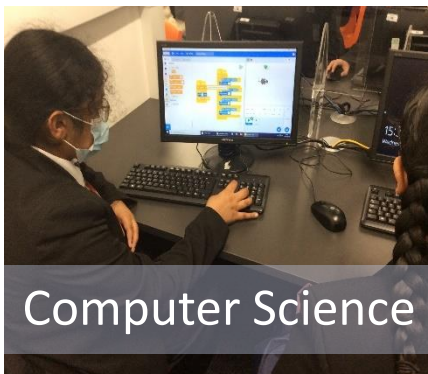

Year 8 Science Virtual online STEM Space Day - Planetarium show

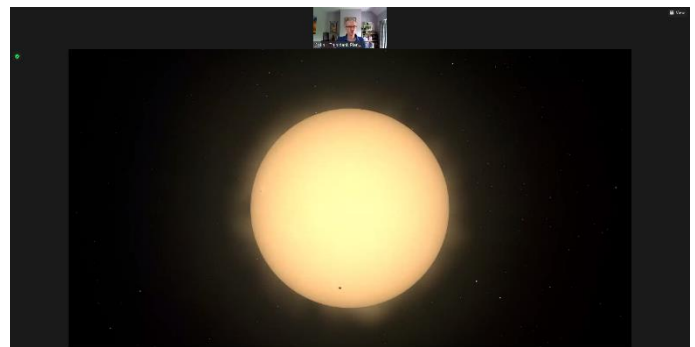
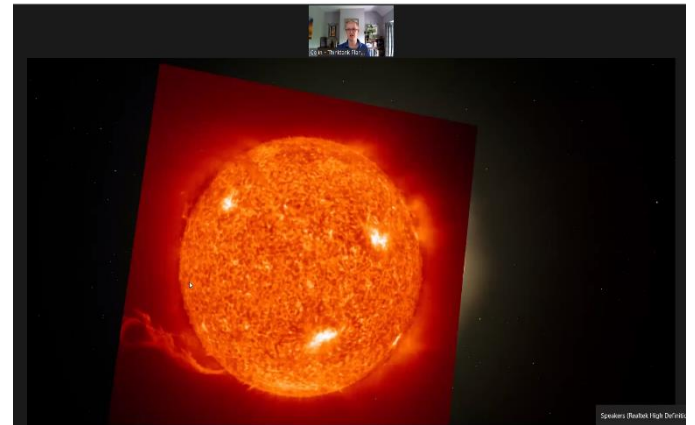
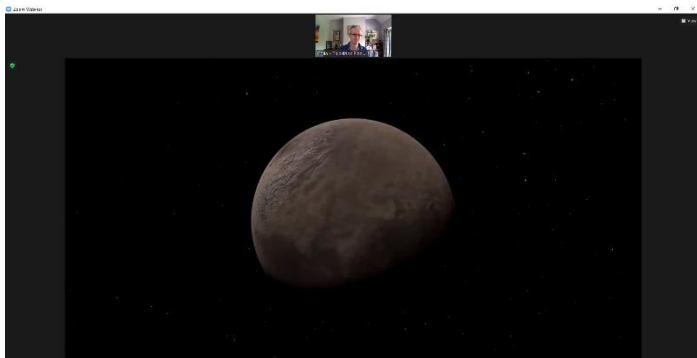

Year 9 Radio Drama Project

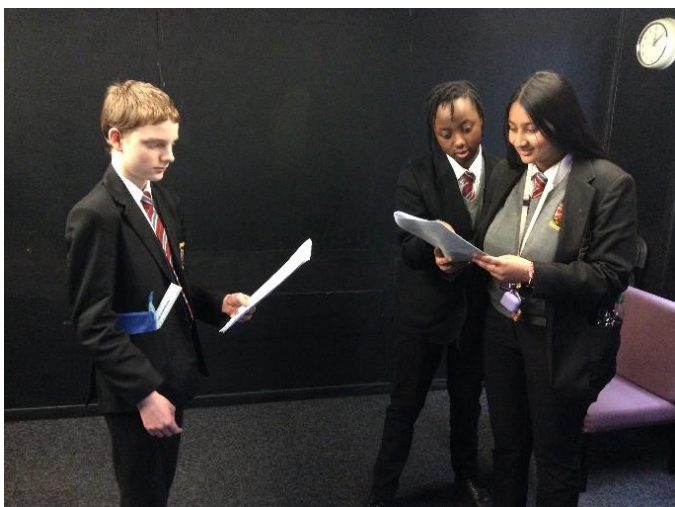
