Headteacher's Message

Thankyou for your continued support in getting all pupils back into school safely over the past few weeks, including the last minute change regarding face coverings due to Birmingham's increased covid 19 restrictions. All of us are committed to providing the best education possible for your child, while securing the health and safety of our whole school community. Thank you for continuing to follow public health guidelines and encouraging your children to do the same.

Here is a summary of the education we are now providing:

**School reopening:** Pupils in all year groups have fully returned for their full timetable. Pupils are separated in year group bubbles for most of the day. This is facilitated safely with staggered entry, lesson changeover, lunch and exit times. If pupils are in corridors with pupils outside their bubble where social distancing is difficult to maintain, they can wear a school face covering. Please see our school website <u>www.sjw.bham.sch.uk</u> and select the 'Covid-19' button for full details of school day timings, permitted face coverings, safety flyers and covid 19 agreement.

**Attendance:** Full attendance is expected in school unless a pupil is isolating as per public health guidelines. Some pupils are arriving after the school start time of 8.50am. Please make every effort to ensure they are on time so important learning is not missed.

**Coverage of the curriculum:** All pupils are being taught the full curriculum and teachers have put in place plans to ensure all pupils rapidly resume their learning. Development homework is available on the school website and pupils can complete this independently at home to assist with catching-up anything missed during March to July 2020. A programme of after school masterclasses is being planned and you will be informed when your child will need to attend. More details next week about online lessons.

Mental health and wellbeing: All pupils have been encouraged to talk to a member of staff if there are any changes to their circumstances, or they are worried or anxious about anything. All staff have received training on bereavement support, mental health support, emotional coaching, restorative justice and circle time. We have also set up a wellbeing@ email address that pupils can use and a team of trained staff can respond to any information shared.

# **BIRMINGHAM CURIOSITIES**

The invention of plastic

It's amazing that Birmingham invented silver electroplating and then went on to produce silverware for the whole world. Did you know that Alexander Parkes, one of the principles at the Elkington electroplating company also invented plastic? He is remembered with a blue plaque on part of the original Elkington factory works on Newhall Street.

Alexander proudly named the plastic 'Parkesine' and set up a factory to make it on Hackney Marshes in East London. The production process was problematic as it used ethanol to extract cellulose from wood pulp, which led to many fires. The process was modified and taken forward by another company who renamed the plastic Xylonite.
