#### Covid 19 testing before returning to school in January 2022

#### Wednesday 5 January 2022

We encourage you to send your child to school between 9.00am and 12.00 midday for a covid 19 test.

Pupils do not need to wear school uniform. They will be tested on site and then sent immediately home.

Consent forms from previous testing will still apply. If your child has not been tested before, please get them to bring a completed consent form.

Consent forms will be sent home with pupils on Wednesday 15 and Thursday 16 December.

It is important to test regularly during the Christmas holidays, and before returning to school. Extra home test kits will be distributed during the last school week in December.

'Bring it on Brum!' is Birmingham's, Department for Education funded, Holiday Activity and Food Programme, that's helping children, young people and their families have active, fun-filled and healthy school holidays.

Bring it on Brum! is for children who access free school meals. The approach in Birmingham will see provision across the city, serving disadvantaged communities, those most vulnerable and those most impacted upon by the pressures of school holidays.

Their winter holiday programme will be delivered in over 180 venues across the city. Many holiday activity providers are ready to take bookings now; some are still finalising their plans. Most programmes will run for 4 or 5 days from Monday 20<sup>th</sup> December. There will be a smaller number of programmes available after Christmas until schools return.

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#### **Tuition at Saint John Wall**

There are two types of tuition at Saint John Wall:

**5 for 5 tuition:** Five pupils are chosen by a class teacher. This teacher will work with the pupils for five 1-hour sessions, focusing on areas for development specific to those pupils. These sessions take place after school between 3pm to 4pm.

#### COVID-19 vaccinations for 12 to 15 year olds

All young people aged 12 to 15 are now eligible to have two doses of the COVID-19 vaccination. A second dose can be given 12 weeks (3 months) after the first dose. Two doses of the Pfizer vaccine will give young people the best protection against COVID-19.

The medicines regulator, the Medicines and Healthcare products Regulatory Agency (MHRA), has confirmed the Pfizer vaccine is safe and effective for children in this age group, following a rigorous review of the safety, quality and effectiveness of the vaccine.

#### How will my child receive their vaccinations?

Vaccinators from the local Children's Vaccination Team will visit your child's school. This is likely to be after the Christmas holidays, with further information being shared nearer the time.

There will also be local appointments that you can book for your child at vaccination centres, as well as walk-in sessions, with no appointment needed. 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#### Is my child eligible?

Your child is eligible to have their vaccination if:

- · For second doses, they must have had their first at least 12 weeks ago
- They have had their 12<sup>th</sup> birthday since vaccinations were offered at their school
- They previously declined to have their first vaccination, but would now like one
- They will not be able to have a vaccination if they have had COVID-19 infection in the last 12 weeks.

#### **Further information**

COVID-19 is usually mild in most children, but it can make some children unwell. Two doses of the COVID-19 vaccine gives the best protection against your child becoming seriously ill. Therefore, we strongly encourage you to take up this offer for your child. Vaccinating children can also help stop the spread of COVID-19 to other people, such as to elderly relatives and within schools.

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# **Internet Safety Notice**

#### Are you aware of what your child is looking up on the internet?

#### Have you checked your parental controls with your internet provider?

# The laptops which were provided through the DfE because of lockdown have some safeguarding monitoring software on them called SMOOTHWALL.

Smoothwall is software which monitors what you type into the laptop (both at home and when using computers in school). However, in school any inappropriate material is blocked to keep your child safe, BUT, if your parental controls are not set correctly your child could be accessing inappropriate materials in your own home.

# What are parental controls?

Parental controls help you to block or filter upsetting or inappropriate content, and control purchases within apps. You can install parental control software on your child's and family's phones or tablets, games consoles, laptops and your home internet.

#### Parental controls can help you to:

- $\circ \quad$  plan what time of day your child can go online and how long for
- o create content filters to block apps that may have inappropriate content
- manage the content different family members can see.

### What can I do next?

Check with your internet provider about the following:

#### Filtering and blocking

• Limit access to specific websites, words or images.

#### **Blocking outgoing content**

• Prevents your children from sharing personal information online and via email.

#### Limiting time

• Allows parents to set time limits for how long their children are online and the time of day they can access the internet.

#### **Monitoring tools**

• Alert parents to their children's online activity without blocking access and can be used with or without the child's knowledge. Some software can record which websites a child has visited. Other programs display warning messages when children visit certain websites.

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
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
