Thank you to Mrs Forde for the jewellery sale last week for Mother's Day and a contribution from the sale of £50 was donated to the school fund.








## **Year 11 Parents' Evening**





Amie and Borbor left no stone unturned to find help, but to no avail. Amie saw a group of new mothers coming along the road, their babies all healthy, and asked where they had come from. They told her about the Sisters. Amie went straight there. Even though they feared there was no hope for little Lombeh, they gave her benny mix – a local weaning food. Lombeh immediately began to improve. Now, aged five, Lombeh is a lively and energetic little girl, who can't believe the stories her mother tells her about when she was a baby.

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#### **Solutions Not Sides**

On Thursday, Year 9 had the opportunity to welcome Solutions Not Sides into school. Solutions Not Sides is an organisation that visits schools to talk about the conflict in the Middle East and discuss possible solutions without picking sides. The pupils were able to listen to Laura and Sharon, our visiting speakers, explain the history and root of the conflict between Palestine and Israel. Pupils listened to two videos showing the lives of two civilians affected by the conflict. These two civilians then dialed into the session via Zoom and our pupils were lucky enough to ask them questions about their experiences. It is very rare to have this opportunity and our pupils rose to the challenge asking some thought-provoking questions about what is happening in the Middle East. These questions included: 'How do you think the media contributes to this conflict? 'Why do countries fund these armies when it is clear the conflict should stop?' and 'How are you fighting for peace?'.

Our visitors and staff praised Year 9 for their excellent behaviour in the session and their thought-provoking questions. Our Year 9 pupils considered how some of these solutions can be used across the world and applied to different situations. 
## **Women's History Month**


## **Careers Focus in English**
