Absence in Term Time

Birmingham City Council and the Department of Education will not authorise leave in term time. Operation Encompass Letter to Parents

Dear Parent/Carer,

I am writing to inform you that with effect from September 2021, Saint John Wall Catholic School will be taking part in a joint operation involving Birmingham Children's Trust, Birmingham City Council, and West Midlands Police. This will formally be known as **Operation Encompass**.

Operation Encompass has been established to help schools provide in-school support to children who have been present at, exposed to or involved in, any domestic abuse incident.

We know that children can be significantly harmed, physically and/or emotionally, during these situations, and that it also negatively affects their learning and behaviour in class.

Therefore, as part of the Operation Encompass procedure, and to help mitigate the resulting negative impact, the school will now receive a confidential phone call or email from West Midlands Police before 9.00am the morning after a child or young person has been witness to, or involved in, any reported domestic abuse incident.

Here at Saint John Wall Catholic School we have a dedicated and child-focussed Safeguarding Team. They are specially trained to effectively use the information the Police share, in confidence, and enable the school to provide the right support to any child and their family.

We always endeavour to offer the best support possible to our pupils and believe this will be extremely beneficial for all those involved.

Top tips to care for your Uniform

Wash your clothes inside out

This will help to stop fading and stop logos from cracking. Don't use too much detergent

Excess detergent and soap can hold dirt and will not rinse clean.

Don't Iron if you do not need to!

Repeated ironing causes wear and tear. Hanging clothes to dry will reduce creases.

Don't tumble dry

Tumble drying will wear out your uniform prematurely, far better to air dry your school uniform.

Kooth is the UK's largest digital mental health platform, providing free mental health and wellbeing support services for young people aged 11-25.



Mental health during childhood and adolescence is very important. Difficulties like anxiety and depression can start when people are young and it is important for young people and their families to understand these difficulties and get support when needed.

The PIPA Trial is exploring the effectiveness of an online resource for parents/carers to help reduce depression and anxiety in young people. The trial is being coordinated by the University of Warwick and involves families of young people aged 11-15 years from schools in Birmingham, Coventry and surrounding areas.

The trial is free and conducted completely online. Eligible parents/carers and young people will be asked to complete some questionnaires. Parents/carers will then receive access to some online parenting resources: either the standard educational package of factsheets or the personalised programme with up to nine modules. Parents/carers and young people will also be asked to complete some follow-up questionnaires.
