Message from the Chair of Governors

'Tis the season to be jolly'

You'd be excused for not thinking so though as we endure not only darker mornings and afternoons but also storms and most alarmingly the on-going spread of the Omicron variant. It is the Season of Advent however when we prepare for the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ at Christmas. There is much therefore to look forward to and to be thankful for.

During these extremely challenging times safeguarding, in all its aspects, remains our main priority. Miss Marston and our brilliant staff continue to work unstintingly to make sure our pupils are able to attend school and be taught and cared for in a safe environment. We owe them all a massive debt of gratitude.

I'd like to take this opportunity also to mention Mr Uddin, the site staff, cleaners and safety associates. Sometimes with all that goes on we can take for granted their tireless and repetitive work. I know Miss Marston and the rest of the staff appreciate their efforts but I hope they know that as governors we too thank them for their diligence and attention to detail.

Great credit also goes to the pupils for their co-operation during these very strange times. I know from the feedback they've given how much they enjoy school. Despite all that happens in the outside world pupils say they feel valued and well looked after by the staff of the school.

To ensure this continues Miss Marston is starting next term on the first Wednesday of the New Year, 5 January. On that day pupils attend school only in the morning. They will be given a Covid 19 test before then returning home. It is really important too that children are tested regularly during the Christmas holidays using the home test kits the school has provided this week. If we think back to the beginning of last January the government suddenly announced all schools were to remain closed after the Christmas and New Year holidays. This might happen again if the effect of the Omicron variant has even more serious effects. Keep up to date by looking at our superb website to get further advice and guidance.

Regarding the work of the governors there has been little progress about our joining a Multi- Academy Company (MAC). Just last weekend I received a message form the Diocesan Education Service (DES) in which they admitted progress across the Archdiocese had been slow and that some schools still remain unconvinced about academy conversion. The DES also said their communication with schools needs improving. Early in January a map is promised including nominating the MAC we are encouraged to join by next September. I shall of course keep you updated if there is any progress.

Before I finish I wish to pass on the good wishes of all members of the school community, past and present, to Miss Allen. As one of our longest serving members of staff thousands of pupils and hundreds of colleagues, Miss Allen is held in the highest regard. I know from personal experience there is no better Maths teacher anywhere than Miss Allen. Nor more loyal a servant of Saint John Wall Catholic School. We all hope to see her up and about again before too long.

Some Year 11 pupils volunteered to go on a trip to King Edwards Handsworth Grammar School for boys on Monday 13 December 2021. The trip was designed to encourage and motivate those who are interested in a grammar school sixth form education. COVID-19 vaccinations for 12 to 15 year olds

All young people aged 12 to 15 are now eligible to have two doses of the COVID-19 vaccination. A second dose can be given 12 weeks (3 months) after the first dose. Two doses of the Pfizer vaccine will give young people the best protection against COVID-19.

The medicines regulator, the Medicines and Healthcare products Regulatory Agency (MHRA), has confirmed the Pfizer vaccine is safe and effective for children in this age group, following a rigorous review of the safety, quality and effectiveness of the vaccine.

How will my child receive their vaccinations?

Vaccinators from the local Children's Vaccination Team will visit your child's school. This is likely to be after the Christmas holidays, with further information being shared nearer the time.

There will also be local appointments that you can book for your child at vaccination centres, as well as walk-in sessions, with no appointment needed. Is my child eligible?

Your child is eligible to have their vaccination if:

- · For second doses, they must have had their first at least 12 weeks ago
- They have had their 12th birthday since vaccinations were offered at their school
- They previously declined to have their first vaccination, but would now like one
- They will not be able to have a vaccination if they have had COVID-19 infection in the last 12 weeks.

Further information

COVID-19 is usually mild in most children, but it can make some children unwell. Two doses of the COVID-19 vaccine gives the best protection against your child becoming seriously ill. Therefore, we strongly encourage you to take up this offer for your child. Vaccinating children can also help stop the spread of COVID-19 to other people, such as to elderly relatives and within schools.
