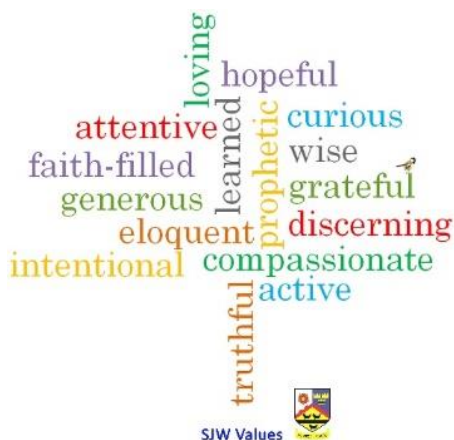

Teachers who are members of the National Education Union have voted to strike again on the following date: **Thursday Tuesday 2 May**. The school has 26 teachers who are in the NEU. We do not expect all those teachers to strike, but we will need to make some changes to pupils' education on each of the strike days if they go ahead.

Due to a likely reduction in teaching staff the following education arrangements will be made:

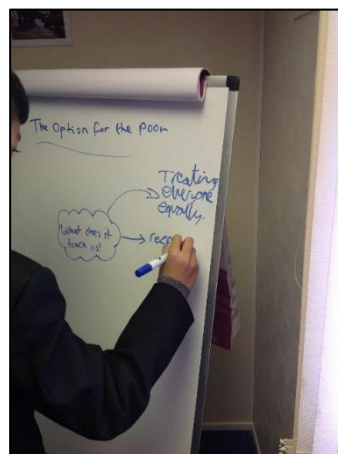
## Year 7 Allotment Visit

## London Marathon 2023 – The Challenge of a Lifetime

On Sunday 23 April, I had the privilege of running the London Marathon for the charity Parkinson's UK. I dreamt of doing the marathon since spectating with my children many years ago, but as I was not a runner at that time never imagined that I would ever realise that dream.

However, 3 years ago I was diagnosed with a neurological condition called Parkinson's which changed my life in many ways, including making me a runner! As advised by my consultant, I started to do 2.5 hours of exercise per week. Lockdown put an end to use of gym, so I started running 5k three times a week. Unfortunately cramping, muscle spasms slow me down, so I now do longer distances at a slower pace. Since then, I have done a few 10k races but decided that this year I needed a bigger challenge! So, I applied for a charity place in the London Marathon with Parkinson's UK. I was amazed that out of the many hundreds of applicants I was lucky enough to be chosen. Then the hard work began!

On January 1<sup>st</sup> I started a 16-week training programme, involving running 4 times per week and building up the distances week by week, until 3 weeks beforehand I ran/walked 20 miles. It required a lot of dedication and determination, running in rain, sleet and snow. I only missed 1 week of training when ill, but it was worth it in the end.

Sunday was amazing an unforgettable experience, one of the best things I have ever done in life. The atmosphere was incredible with people cheering and shouting your name at every turn. It was like a carnival with bands playing and DJ's and dancers. My whole family were there at regular cheering points which gave me a boost. More importantly I knew that every mile meant more money raised and awareness of the charity. Thank you so much to all the pupils and staff for their generosity, the contributions from the non-uniform day and many personal donations from staff amounted to about £500 of the £3000 raised so far.

So, whatever challenges you may face in life, set new goals, be determined and just do what little you can to improve the situation.

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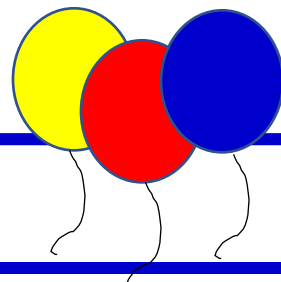
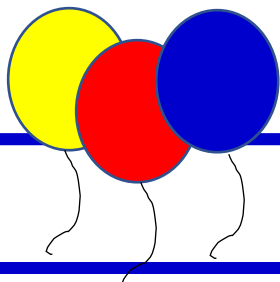


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## Rock Climbing Year 7

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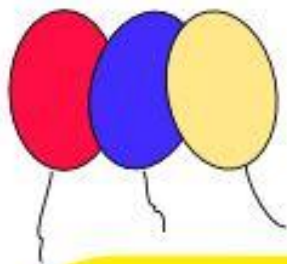

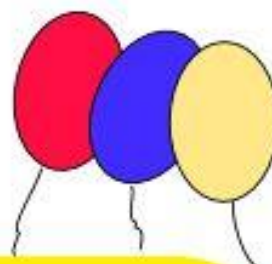
