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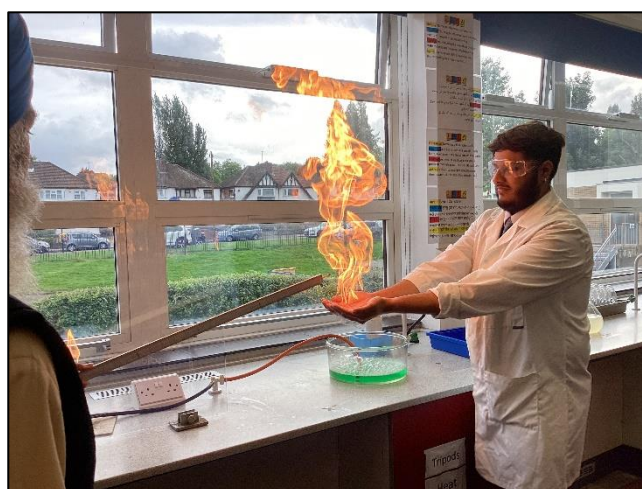
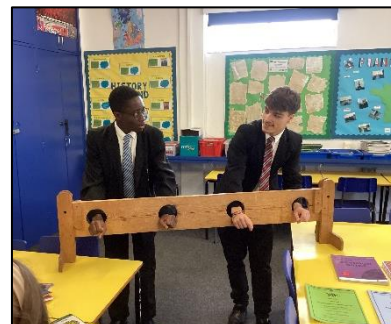


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Open Evening

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Work Experience

Our pupils at the end of Year 10 undertook work experience, which involved going on a short-term placement with an employer, to observe and work alongside people as they go about their daily tasks. This was a chance for the pupils to develop skills, contacts, and learn more about the kind of career they would like to do.

I am pleased to report our pupils really enjoyed the experience and the opportunities. I believe this will make our pupils stand out from the crowd on applications for courses, training and jobs. Please see below some feedback from the pupils.

"I enjoyed my work experience and the people there were very kind and caring. As shown when the headteacher of my old school says that "they have been a part of their school, and are still a member of the school". The quote stated by the headteacher suggests that I have been to that school before and would choose to try my work experience in that school to make education better for the children there. The quote also enforces the fact that I have been in that school before and have studied there, and so I am able to give good advice to the people there still studying. "In my work experience I have learnt about how to get to places at a set time and learn to sign in and give in my phone and take care of children. I learnt that being a teacher means you have to make sure that the children are not only safe but are having fun. I also learnt that it takes more than just standing there to make sure they are okay, I had to interact with them and play with them, so I knew they were okay. SJW Supper Club (Bouncing)

This is an exciting after school enrichment opportunity which will start again on Monday 25 September. Here are some key details:

- Monday-Friday every week during term time.
- Pupils do not need to sign-up they just turn up. First come first served, 30 spaces.
- Led by an external company- Bouncing Statistics with support from one of our school pupil coaches.
- 3.15-4.30 enrichment activities e.g. sports, board games, creative activities, jigsaws, homework. Pupils can liaise with Bouncing Statistics staff/ school pupil coach about other activities they would like (Please note- if pupils attend, they will not be able to leave school site until 4.30pm).
- 4.30-4.45 food and drink. This is optional, pupils do not have to stay for this, but it is free of charge.
- If you plan on collecting your child at 4.30pm, please contact the school office, otherwise pupils will be allowed to leave site from 4.30pm.

DLP Hub, Tesco Trip

On Thursday, as part of our Preparing for Adulthood and Careers lesson, Miss Lai and I took the pupils in the Hub to our local Tesco Express. The pupils studied Food and Nutrition and Eating on a Budget.

First, pupils took time to research healthy food items that they could buy to sustain them for a few days on a budget of £5.00.

They researched the prices of the food items they wanted to buy, using their maths skills totalled up their shopping and their expected change.

Food purchased:

Meal: 1 Pasta, pasta sauce and cheese.

Meal 2: Rice, chicken drumsticks and a mango.

Meal 3: Pasta, pasta sauce and corn on the cob.

Meal 4: Rice, chicken drumsticks, peas, and all spice.

Two of the meals went slightly over budget but the others were perfect.

This was a fantastic experience for the pupils learning; social and communication skills, meeting and greeting shop assistants and members of the public and using good manners.

Understanding the value of money, sticking to a budget, rather than buying a 'meal deal' you can buy groceries that you can turn into a healthy meal that will last a few days.

A member of the public was so pleased to see pupils learning about life skills he spoke to Miss Lai and the pupils telling them how lucky they were having a trip out and learning how to shop. He went on to explain how important education is as he was not taught any life experiences. **By Mrs Kaur**

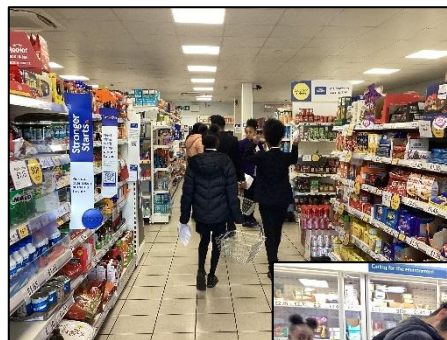
