- Monday to Friday every week during term time.
- Pupils do not need to sign-up they just turn up. First come first served, 30 spaces.
- Led by an external company Bouncing Statistics with support from one of our school pupil coaches.
- 3.15-4.30 enrichment activities e.g. sports, board games, creative activities, jigsaws, homework. Pupils can liaise with Bouncing Statistics staff/ school pupil coach about other activities they would like (Please note- if pupils attend, they will not be able to leave school site until 4.30pm).
- 4.30-4.45 food and drink. This is optional, pupils do not have to stay for this, but it is free of charge.





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
