



"In the NHS workshop, we created a poster focusing on pregnancy and talked about the experiences of pregnant women." **By Mercedes Johnson 10HAS**



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
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MAD Museum & Butterfly Farm

Nechells Wellbeing Centre



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Respiratory System Dissection


Rewards Week
