Message from Chair of Governors

"We create a past to reminisce about".

Anybody involved with Birmingham schools twenty-five or so years ago will have been saddened to learn of the death, just before Christmas, of Professor Tim Brighouse. During his time as the city's Chief Education Officer Tim inspired many with his compassion and thoughtfulness. His overriding conviction was that every teacher could improve further by looking for methods that worked elsewhere and adapting them for his or her own circumstances. After he left Birmingham Tim worked in London before retiring. If he'd had the opportunity to visit Saint John Wall today, he would have seen the philosophy of education he held and encouraged in so many others being put into practice.

A report from the Centre for Social Justice found that 28% of the parents surveyed agreed "that the Covid pandemic has shown it is not essential for children to attend school every day". This poses such a problem that the current Education Secretary has made tackling attendance her "number one priority". As governors we are fully behind the steps Mrs Crooks and all the staff are taking to support parents in encouraging their children to attend school. It is vital to be in school every single day particularly for our Year 11 pupils as public exams approach. She informed us that pupil attendance at Saint John Wall is far higher than it is nationally. In fact, over 300 pupils have a 100% attendance record. Congratulations to them. Attendance is the key to a successful future.



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An idea the government has proposed to help improve attendance is to offer young people more sporting activities after school. It is very timely, therefore, that Mrs Ratcliffe has taken up the role of School Games Organiser as well as Lead Teacher for PE and Health. She will be working hard to increase the participation of pupils in sport and exercise activities throughout our local primary and secondary schools.

You will be aware from the news of the measles epidemic in the West Midlands. I recently attended a presentation for governors on what a highly infectious disease measles is and how its effects can be extremely serious. The importance of having two doses of the MMR Vaccine for protection was emphasised. I would encourage parents to look again at the school newsletter of 12 January in which Miss Marston published detailed information.

We regularly hear government announcements that record funding is being made in education. I have to admit it doesn't feel like it. Ahead of the new financial year in April governors recently attended a meeting where we went through the school budget section by section and line by line. Thanks to the expertise of Mr Holden and Mrs Whitehouse everything possible is being done to ensure all money goes to offering our pupils the best quality of education possible. Speaking of which Miss Marston has informed me that regarding the exam performance of pupils from disadvantaged circumstances Saint John Wall is ranked an astonishing 33rd out of the three and a half thousand or so secondary schools in the whole of England! Tim Brighthouse would certainly have agreed that is an outstanding performance although I'm less sure about Ofsted!

At a recent governors' meeting Mr Lloyd-Price updated us on the Catholic Life of the school. This year's focus is the 'Year of Live Simply' with the school striving to be awarded CAFOD's Live Simply Award. His very comprehensive report stressed how pupils are willingly taking leadership roles with the school's chaplaincy provision. Outreach work has involved class Masses at St Augustine's Primary School, weekly visits to St Mary's senior citizen group as well as monthly visits to St Chad's Sanctuary. Next week sees Ash Wednesday marking the start of Lent. Many more activities are planned to celebrate this most Holy of seasons. To keep up to date with all aspects of school life please remember to look every Friday at the school newsletter brilliantly put together by Mr Mull. Following a visit to the school Mr Smith, an RE adviser from the Archdiocese, wrote in his report that:

'The school newsletter is just one explicit example of how the school celebrates its Catholic identity and of being a Catholic school for all with 'Christ at the heart'.'

Friday marks the end of what has been a very short half-term. Pupils return on Monday 19 February for what is another very short half-term. It sees the start of the final build-up to the summer exams for Year 11s beginning in May.

The past weeks, however, have been overshadowed by the very sad news of the death, on New Year's Eve, of Helen Harms. Before retiring last summer Helen set a wonderful example of what it is to be a teacher of Religious Education in a Catholic school. At a recent parents' evening a parent wrote in their feedback that: **"Saint John Wall Catholic School's core values include a spiritual framework and moral guidance... with an emphasis on human dignity and Good consciousness."** Helen embodied such qualities both in and out of the classroom and indeed inside and outside of school. Her deeply held faith and the care she demonstrated for others affected all who knew her. I am sure it was consoling to her family and friends to witness the presence of so many Saint John Wall staff, both past and present, at Helen's Service of Committal and Service of Remembrance and Thanksgiving. Tim Brighthouse once said of those of us who have the privilege of working in schools that "we create a past to reminisce about". Helen's memory will remain with us all.

Until the next time I'll end with this prayer for Helen and for Tim Brighthouse:

Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord and let perpetual light shine upon them. May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

Saint John Wall, pray for us.


House Rewards

Football Match



Exciting News! School Hall to be refurbished into a working theatre.

Over the past 18 months Saint John Wall has taken part in a process of writing a bid to have our school hall refurbished into a working theatre space. We are absolutely thrilled to announce that we have been awarded a sum of money from the Wolfson Foundation that means our pupils will benefit from much needed improvements to the facilities. This should include improvements to the lighting, sound system and dressing of the stage. The work will take place over the summer holidays ready for teaching in September 2024. As part of this development, we are excited to be able to offer GCSE Drama from September for the first time. Our current Year 8 pupils will be able to consider this when making their pathway choices in the coming weeks. After the success of our Christmas Pantomime, we are very much looking forward to seeing our next show enhanced by our new facilities.

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Birmingham Police & Schools Panel

Saint John Wall Catholic School is committed to keeping our students safe, both in school and the wider community. As part of our safeguarding arrangements, we have a two-way information sharing agreement in place with West Midlands Police, and we are also active members of our local constituency Police & Schools Panel.

The agreement is compliant with Crime & Disorder Act 1998, Data Protection Act 2018 – 2021 Update and United Kingdom General Data Protection Regulation (UK-GDPR); and focuses on preventing young people from becoming involved, or further involved, in crime and anti-social behaviour (as either a victim or offender) or those who have been reported as missing that may be vulnerable as a result.

We also work with the Police on matters to do with prohibited items in school such as vapes and illegal substances. If you are concerned about any of these areas please contact school or the Police using 101.
