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Ramadan

We are proud to be a Catholic School for All and welcome pupils and staff of all faiths and enjoy celebrating their faith with them.

Following the guidance from Birmingham City Council, we would like to draw your attention to a few key points:

- We allow and encourage Muslim pupils to fast during this time. In the event of a medical (e.g. dehydration) or safeguarding emergency, we will contact home first to discuss next steps. However, in line with the guidance, if we notice signs of dehydration or exhaustion, we will ask them to drink some water and remind them that Islamic law allows them to break their fast and make it up later.
- We ask that you encourage your child to minimise physical activity at break and lunch time and use this time to rest and increase their energy levels to face the rest of the day.
- Pupils will be expected to participate in PE lessons but are allowed to moderate some of their activity.
- A quiet space is available for pupils in the library or Chapel if they choose not to be on the playground.

We wish our Muslim brothers and sisters at St John Wall a holy month.
