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




Attendance

Thank you to parents and carers for supporting their child's attendance to school in September. All pupils who have 100% attendance and punctuality all week can expect to be awarded 5 class charts positives at the end of the week.

Attendance for September



It is especially important for Year 11 pupils to be in school <u>every</u> <u>day.</u> Nationally: More than half (54%) of pupils who were persistently absent in Year 10 and then rarely absent in Year 11, passed at least 5 GCSEs, compared to 36% of pupils who were persistently absent in both years. Missing days can create gaps that weaken your overall understanding and performance. Each day you attend school, you are provided with a wealth of information, support, and resources that are designed to help you succeed. Regular attendance is more than just about academic success. It's about building good habits that will serve you well throughout your life for future employers and higher education institutions. Ensure your attendance improves allowing you to achieve your potential.

How can parents/carers continue to ensure their child has excellent attendance to school?

- Ensure your child attends school every day it is open, on time, escorting them into school if necessary and handing them over to a member of staff. (Please be aware your child may get an unauthorised absence mark when they arrive after registration closes).
- Contact school on the first day of every absence by 9.30am stating the reason for absence and the likely return date.
- Take your child to the doctor if unwell and provide the school with: medical appointment card with one appointment entered, letter from a professional, medication prescribed by a doctor, copy of prescription, print screen of medical notes, as well as letters concerning hospital appointments or any other relevant evidence. (The Head Teacher will not authorise medical absence without evidence).


Next week afterschool revision will begin - this will be everyday apart from Fridays. These revision sessions are compulsory for all pupils in Year 11 to support their learning.

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DLP Hub – Tesco Trip

On Tuesday, as part of our Preparing for Adulthood and Careers lesson, Mrs Kaur and I took the pupils in the Hub to our local Tesco Express. The pupils studied Food and Nutrition and Eating on a Budget.

Pupils took time to research healthy food items that they could buy to sustain them for a few days on a budget of £5.00. By understanding the value of money and sticking to a budget, pupils are aware that rather than buying a 'meal deal' you can buy groceries that you can turn into a healthy meal that will last longer. Using their math's skills, they researched the prices for their ingredients to make sure they do not go over budget.

Food purchased were:

Meal 1: Pasta, chicken drumstick and cheese.

- Meal 2: Rice, chicken drumsticks and potato wedges.
- Meal 3: Pasta, olives, tomatoes and peppers.
- Meal 4: Pasta, chicken breasts, peas, onions and garlic.


