Absence in Term Time

The headteacher <u>may not</u> grant any leave in term time, this will only be granted in exceptional circumstances. Parents taking their children out of school without authorisation may be served with a Penalty Notice by the Local Authority, which may result in court action and could result in your child's name being removed from our school roll. This means your child would no longer have a place at this school. The school is operating Birmingham City Councils Attendance Process.

Parking Outside School

Pupils are encouraged to walk, take the bus or cycle to school. Secure bike parking is available. The 101 bus stops outside the school. Parents are asked to take care and attention when dropping off and picking up their children. We recommend you park on a side road and your child walks to meet you away from the busy school entrance area. Please observe the road traffic signs, school bollards, no parking on the pavements and be aware of children crossing between cars and buses.

'My Child at School' (MCAS)

If you have not already done so, please ensure that you have made an account so that you will be able to pay for your child's lunch/trips and also to view your child's academic performance, attendance, behaviour and class charts. You will also receive important information like the Weekly Bulletin/Monthly Newsletter.

Change of Details

Please let the school know if you change any details ie contact number, email address, change of contact, any new medical condition/s your child has been diagnosed with. If you change your address you will need to provide school with proof of your new address i.e. utility bill, council tax bill. It is very important that the school has been notified of any new medical conditions your child has straight away so that if any emergency arises, we are aware on how to deal with it.

Year 10 Visit to Hamstead Hall Academy Wednesday 16 July 2025


Jubilee Week Activities

Jubilee Week Activities


Year 7 welcomed Water Aid, Compass, Matt Franks and PC Manns to school to focus on key issues in the local community including drugs, mental health and bullying.

Year 9 History Trip to National Justice Museum Thursday 17 July 2025

Jubilee Week Activities

On Thursday 17th July, Ms Levine, Mr Lysaght, Mr Mull and I accompanied the Year 9 Historians to the National Justice Museum in Nottingham. Pupils took part in a range of engaging activities and enjoyed a guided tour of the museum.

A highlight of the day was a mock trial based on the historical case of Derek Bentley, which pupils have recently studied in class. Pupils took on a range of courtroom roles including judge, defence barristers, solicitors, jurors, and witnesses. Ameera gave a standout performance in the role of Derek Bentley, bringing the case to life. The prosecution barristers and solicitors were praised for their intelligence and thoughtful arguments, showing a clear understanding of the issues involved.

During the museum tour, pupils explored how crime and punishment in Britain has changed over time. They viewed a range of historical artefacts, including a pillory, scold's bridle, and ducking stool. In the original dungeons, pupils were able to see firsthand the harsh conditions prisoners faced and discussed the impact and legacy of prison reformers such as John Howard and Elizabeth Fry, whose efforts helped to transform the treatment of prisoners in the 18th and 19th centuries.

Overall, the Year 9 Historians had a thoroughly enjoyable and thought-provoking day. Staff at the National Justice Museum commended the group for their exemplary behaviour and impressive engagement throughout.



Dear Parents/Carers and pupils,

HAPPY, SAFE SUMMER – REMINDER FROM WEST MIDLANDS POLICE

The summer holiday is fast approaching, it is important our pupils are reminded what we, as a school community, expect of them in terms of behaviour while they are enjoying socialising with friends and family during the break. We also want to ensure they feel confident to keep themselves safe and away from crime and anti-social behaviour.

Parents/carers and pupils should already be aware that as part of our safeguarding arrangements, the school has a two-way information sharing agreement in place with West Midlands Police, and we are active members of the local Police & Schools Panel. This joint approach helps us to intervene early to prevent and reduce crime and antisocial behaviour involving our pupils and provide support and up-to-date safety messages.

In partnership with the police, we would like to provide some reminders about the following:

Personal Safety:

- Be aware of your surroundings, take care of friends and family members and keep valuables (such as smartphones/watches/headphones) out of public view whenever possible.
- For apple devices parents/carers can active 'Find My' which includes Activation Lock A feature that is
 designed to prevent anyone else from using your iPhone, iPad, or iPod touch, if it's ever lost or stolen.
 Activation Lock turns on automatically when you turn on 'Find My' on your device more details on this
 feature are available here: Activation Lock for iPhone and iPad Apple Support
- Don't drink alcohol, take illegal drugs or unknown substances (Including in Vapes); as they can have a big
 impact on your health and safety, behaviour, and your ability to do well at school and enjoy other interests
 and activities. They can also be addictive and have unpredictable side effects and could even have fatal
 consequences Information is available at www.talktofrank.com
- Swimming in rivers/reservoirs: Reservoirs may look inviting, especially on a hot day, but they are extremely dangerous places to swim. If you jump in, you may not be able to get out as the sides are very steep; the water never gets above 11 degrees, and this will affect your ability to breathe and to move. Rivers and reservoirs may be deeper than you think. Safety information is available here: Float To Live What To Do In An Emergency RNLI
- Social Media: Don't allow your use of social media to put you at risk of grooming, exploitation, or regret in
 future. Use social media positively and avoid being negative about anyone online as comments/actions may
 be traced back to you and you will be held accountable.
- Weapons in public places: Carrying a knife or other weapon will get you a criminal record which can have lifelong effects on travel and job prospects. Those who carry knives are also much more likely to be injured by them. Don't take BB Guns, Gel Blasters/Guns, or any other real looking toy guns into public spaces as these can cause alarm to the public - which could receive a Police Firearms response.









- · Anti-social behaviour: Think about your actions towards others; a little thought & respect goes a long way.
- Off-road bikes: These can only be ridden on private land with the landowner's permission. Don't risk your life
 and future prospects by illegally riding these on the road.
- E-Scooters: In the UK, you must be at least 18 years old and hold a provisional or full driving licence to ride a
 hire e- scooter. A privately owned e-scooter can only be used in a private place with the landowner's
 permission; they are illegal to use on a road or in a public place.
- Remember the company you keep: If your friend breaks the law, your association with that person may have legal consequences for you, which could be very serious – even if you weren't the one directly responsible.

If a pupil is in a position where they need help, they should talk to an adult they trust. Crimes can be reported directly to the police via 101; alternatively, you can contact Crimestoppers anonymously on 0800 555 111 or via www.crimestoppers-uk.org. If a crime is taking place or a life is in danger, call 999 immediately.

Dear Headteacher,

The tragic loss of a teenager at Powell's Pool in Sutton Park on 10th July 2025 has highlighted the dangers of open water, especially for young people during this period of hot weather.

In the West Midlands our main sources of water danger are from canals, rivers, lakes and ponds but your pupils might be visiting the beach over the summer period.

Given the summer holidays are around the corner, we urge you to pass on the safety messages to pupils through any written communications, during assemblies and in any wider planned communications to parents before the end of term.

Our website provides useful water safety statistics and resources WMFS - Water Safety.

We also highly recommend the resources provided by the RNLI tailored to different age groups RNLI Education Resources For Young People.

Thinking about the next academic year, I would encourage you to book the appropriate WMFS Safety Education for your key stages.

- For Early Years/Foundation we can provide a Nursery Box (at cost) that has resources for child safety.
- For Year 1 you can request us to come into school to deliver an education package around "Great Fire of London".
- In Year 4 our operational fire crews will visit school to deliver SPARKs. The 1 hour session covers water, fire and road safety.
- Our interactive education centre "Safeside" provides a memorable school trip covering a wide range of safety messages aimed at Year 5.
- We will come into school at Year 8 to deliver a package focussing on fire, water and road safety that also covers wider topics including ASB, arson, personal safety and evehicle safety.
