## **Raising Money for the British Royal Legion**

This Remembrance Day as always, our school community came together to honour those who served and sacrificed in times of conflict. On Monday at 11am, we observed a two-minute silence, with pupils and staff reflecting on the bravery and resilience of veterans and those who gave their lives for peace. This tradition stems from the fact that The Armistice, was signed at 11am on 11 November 1918.
