### Advent Appeal Launch

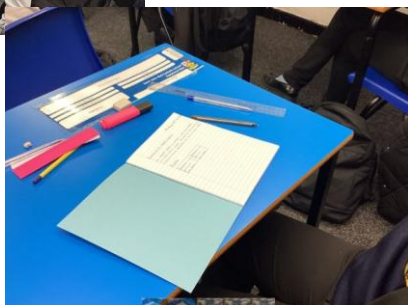

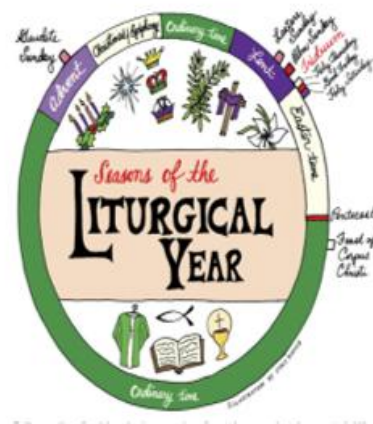
## Liturgical Season

**GREEN** is used during 'Ordinary time', a season focused on Jesus' three-year teaching & preaching.

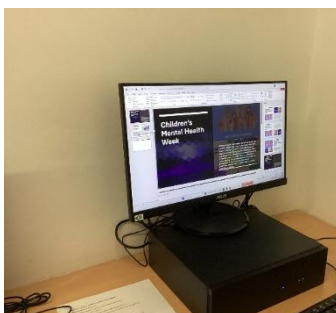

#### Mock Examinations – February

Students must take these mocks seriously and approach them with the same commitment they would their final GCSEs.

Strong preparation is essential at this stage of the year— after the launch of Mock 2 during the middle of January the key message to take away is **revision is temporary, results are forever!**

#### Examination Homework Booklets

A key priority for this half term is the completion of **Examination Homework Booklets**. These booklets play a vital role in exam preparation and support structured study at home. Pupils who fail to complete their examination homework will be required to attend **Friday Homework Club**, where work must be completed. This ensures that all pupils remain supported and on track during this crucial period.

Maintaining consistent habits now will make a significant difference—**revision is temporary, results are forever!**

#### Post-16 Applications and Interviews

It has been extremely positive to see so many Year 11 pupils attending **college and sixth-form interviews**. These experiences are invaluable, helping pupils build confidence, develop communication skills, and better understand the expectations of further education.

We strongly encourage all pupils to continue **exploring options, attending interviews, and submitting applications**. Even if you already hold a conditional offer, it is important to keep your options open and ensure you have choices available. This proactive approach will support a smooth transition into

Post-16 education.

Following the completion of the February mock examinations, pupils will have the opportunity to attend a **Rewards Trip to Alton Towers**. Attendance on this trip will be based on pupils demonstrating **excellence across the year**, including:

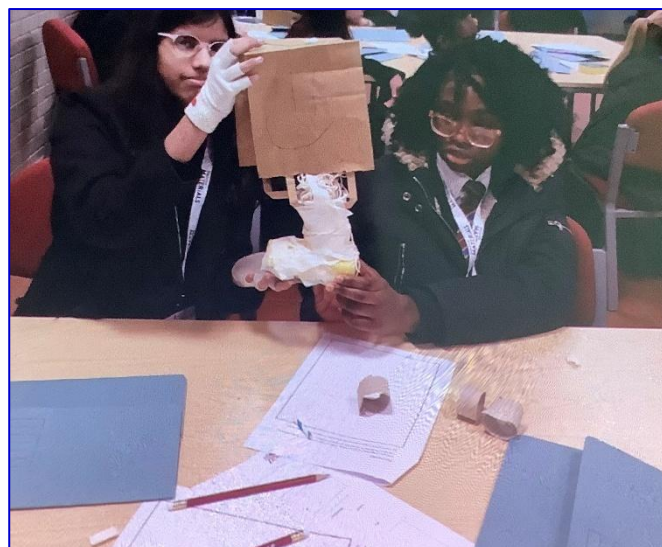

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## NEA Success: Plagiarism, AI & Referencing Guide

*"Plagiarism is the failure to acknowledge sources properly and/or the submission of another person's work as if it were the candidate's own." - (JCQ)*

### 🚫 Examples of Plagiarism

- Submitting work that isn't your own.
- Changing a few words and claiming it's original.
- Letting others access your coursework (SharePoint, email).
- Helping another pupil produce their work.
- Using books, websites, or AI without referencing them.
- Using AI tools to generate work without declaring them.



### 🔍 Plagiarism Detection & Punishment

- Teachers monitor your progress and check if you understand your work.
- Work is compared to earlier work for changes in tone, vocab, grammar, etc.
- AI signs such as mixed UK/US spelling, overly formal or vague writing.
- Unusual fonts or formatting that changes may raise flags.
- Work is scanned using tools like 'Turnitin'.
- Everyone must sign a no-plagiarism declaration NEA form.
- **Consequences include: 0 marks for the work and disqualification from the NEA or subject. In serious cases, disqualification from all subjects and being barred from re-entering exams for a period.**

### 💬 Referencing work

- Referencing means giving credit to the original source of any material you did not create yourself.
- Use quotation marks " " for anything copied, you then will need to explain it and show understanding to earn marks.

### 🧠 Using AI in Coursework

- Pupils must not use AI to generate work that isn't solely their own ideas.
- If AI is used, it must be referenced.
- Using AI without acknowledgement is classed as plagiarism.
- Pupils are expected to sign a declaration confirming this.

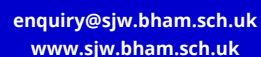
