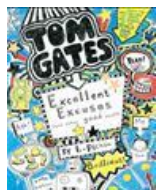

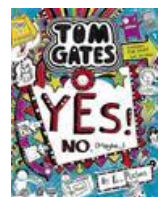

Tom Gates sometimes has trouble making up his mind, and when he hesitates he sometimes loses out.

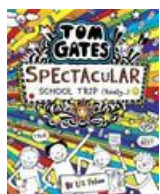

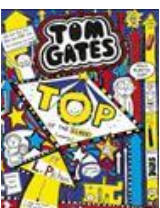

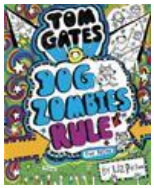

Not only does Tom have to worry about a very important test, he also has to avoid the school bully and find his missing drawing.

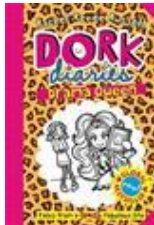

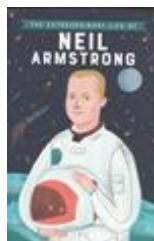
