





New Accelerated Reader Books

Virgo and Elliot must learn to be heroes when death-daemon Thanatos and his scary mum are at large, determined to destroy the world. Book #2





Elliot Hooper's life has got worse. To save his mum he must now go beyond the mortal realm on an odyssey of his own. Book #3



The Gods fight a final battle to save mortals from Thanatos with Elliot's help. Book #4




Ages 14 Plus


Ages 14 Plus


Ages 14 Plus




